**VISITOR COMMENTS:** Commissioner McDonald wanted to attend our meeting so she may introduce herself and ask if there was anything she could do to help our township. She gave a nice introduction on herself, her background including time as a mayor and also to hand out the State of Union for our County pamphlet. Mr. Moyer thanked her for helping us with previous snow removal issues and delays with the County. She told the trustees she was there if there was ever anything she could help us with.

Mr. Bain and Mr. Hassink from Spectrum came to request a change in our current requirements from their drop lines to customer's housing siting the 30-inch requirement and the permit process is not only expensive but timely; they are required to have internet access provided to a customer within seven (7) days. They understand the issue with these small cables being placed in the ditch and promise to avoid that area at all costs. After much discussion our trustees agreed to a 12-inch depth with Spectrum providing a contract where they take full responsibility for repairs and costs should one of those wires ever be cut – this is due to the fact that our Road Department has no way to locate these wires as they are not required to be part of the 811 "Call Before You Dig" requirement.

**FIRE: Chief Erisman**

- The new “used” medic that they purchased was put into service last Friday. They changed their mind on selling the old one and will use it when running medic for mutual aid. New medic was \$80,000 as compared to a new one at \$330,000.

**POLICE: Chief Bruner**

- In October, Officers were dispatched to 86 calls for service and took 40 reports. We took:
  - 3 motor vehicle crashes
  - 22 traffic stops were made
  - 9 citations given
  - 16 verbal warnings
- Trick or treat went well, we handed out candy at the Township Administration Building.
- The fence and gate are complete at the new office, and the opener is operational.
- Chief had the west property line located for future reference to keep it from being planted with crops in the future. I think this will help cut down on the amount of debris that the lot takes during harvest. I would also like to plan trees to as a wind break/privacy line.
- Chief informed the trustees that he is currently in an 80-hour Instructional Skills class through OPOTA at Sinclair. This will give me the opportunity to teach our officers CPT at the range.
- Mr. Moyer asked Chief Bruner if he knew why all of our roads coming into the village go from 55-25 mph with no other intermediate drop? Chief stated he did not know but it is an issue.

- Finished dirt wok and seeding on Clayton Road.
- Finished repairs on Venus Rd.
- Working on repairs on Lower Gratis Road.
- Finished dirt work on parking lot at the Park.
- Snow today, was out salting.

- Recycle Center work schedule needs volunteers for 2026.
- Two quotes were received from Tom Sears on work to be done at the pool and park. The quote from Gates looks to be the best option at \$5,900. The quote from Dishers Additions was \$7,750. Mr. Hodson made motion to accept the quote from Gates and Mr. DeVilbiss seconded the motion; Motion passed.
